

CARROLLTON, Ga. – The West Georgia Tech softball team earned a doubleheader split against Georgia Gwinnett Sunday afternoon, losing 4-2 before winning the nightcap 7-5. The Golden Knights are now 1-3 overall on the young season.

In the first game West Georgia Tech outhit Georgia Gwinnett 7-5 but could not overcome an early two run deficit.

Courtney Braswell (2-for-3) and Robin Mitchell (2-for-2, RBI) led WGTC at the plate. Morgan Anderson allowed just one run and one hit over four innings of relief.

The Golden Knights responded with a 7-5 victory in game two. West Georgia Tech broke open a 4-4 tie by scoring two runs in the fifth and held on behind the relief pitching of Anderson. Anderson scattered three hits while allowing a single run over two innings of work.

Seven different West Georgia Tech batters collected hits in the contest. Mitchell went 2-for-3 for her second multi-hit game of the day. She went 4-for-5 over the two games of the doubleheader.

I was very pleased with the performance of my team this weekend," said WGTC head coach Stephanie Herrera. "We fell short a couple of times but played well. We have so much athleticism on our team that the players have got to come together as a team and work together."
